Class Expectations: Students are expected to come to class prepared and with a positive attitude. All work must be completed in BLUE or BLACK ink. Pencil, marker, or other color ink will not be accepted. Students are expected to be able to participate in group and interact in an appropriate manner with classmates. Assignments are expected to be turned in on time and with the appropriate amount of time and consideration taken into each assignment. Name, date, and class period should be in the top right hand corner of every paper turned in.

Class Rules: In order for class to run smoothly, students are to adhere to the following rules.

1. TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WISH TO BE TREATED! Show respect towards each other and adults at all times.
2. No food or drinks with the **exception of water** is allowed in the classroom.
