  - How did you connect with your audience?
  - What is the purpose of the PSA?
  - What is the tone of your PSA?
  - What is the strongest moment of your PSA?
  - What was it like working in your group?

- Remember, to get full credit for these, you have you use persuasive appeals!
- Write about what appeals (ethos, logos, pathos) are used and how they are used.
