2. impervious

- Not affected or hurt by; admitting of no passage or entrance
- Adjective
- Synonyms:

3. impetus

- A moving force, impulse, stimulus
- Noun
- Synonyms: impulse, incentive, spur
- Antonyms: curb, hindrance, impediment, constraint
- The coming of winter gave a new <u>impetus</u> to the appeals for food and clothing for needy families.

4. jeopardy

- Danger
- Noun
- Synonyms: risk, hazard, peril
- Antonyms: safety, security
- Experienced mountaineers know that a single mistake can put an entire expedition in serious jeopardy.

5. meticulous

- Extremely careful; particular about details
- Adjective
- Synonyms: fastidious, painstaking, fussy
- Antonyms: careless, negligent, sloppy
- If you have a full-time job outside the home, you may find it exceedingly difficult to be a meticulous housekeeper.

6. nostalgia

- A longing for something past; homesickness
- Noun
- Looking at old scrapbooks and reading old letters can bring on a vagus sense of nostalgia for days gone by and friends no longer near.

7. quintessence

- The purest essence or form of something;
 the most typical example
- Noun
- Synonyms: paragon, exemplar
- Ricking one's own life to save the lives of others is considered the <u>quintessence</u> of selfless valor.

8. retrogress

- To move backward; to return to an earlier condition
- Verb
- Synonyms: revert, degenerate, decline
- Antonyms: advance, evolve, progress
- In the novel, the survivors of a nuclear explosion <u>retrogress</u> into a state of barbarism and anarchy.

9. scrutinize

- To examine closely
- Verb
- Synonyms: inspect, pore over
- Antonyms: skim, scan, glance at
- Lawyers are paid to <u>scrutinize</u> legal papers and explain the fine print to their clients.

10. tepid

- Lukewarm; unenthusiastic, marked by an absence of interest
- adjective
- Synonyms: insipid, halfhearted, wishywashy
- Antonyms: heated, excited, enthusiastic
- A cup of <u>tepid</u> tea will not warm you up on a chilly morning.
