### 1. harass

- To disturb, worry; to trouble by repeated attacks
- Verb
- Synonyms: annoy, pester, bedevil, beleaguer
- The judge repeatedly cautioned the prosecuting attorney not to <u>harass</u> the witness.

### 2. inclement

- Stormy, harsh; severe in attitude or action
- Adjective
- Synonyms: blustery, tempestuous, implacable
- Antonyms: mild, gentle, balmy, tranquil
- During an <u>inclement</u> New England winter, heavy snowfalls may bring highway traffic to a standstill.

### 3. muse

- To think about in a dreamy way, ponder
- Verb
- Synonyms: meditate, contemplate, daydream
- Philosophers have always <u>mused</u> on the meaning of life.

## 4. negligible

- So unimportant that it can be disregarded
- Adjective
- Synonyms: trivial, inconsequential, insignificant
- Antonyms: significant, crucial, momentous
- After taxes are deducted, a small raise in salary may result in a <u>negligible</u> increase in take-home pay.

### 5. perpetuate

- To make permanent or long lasting
- Verb
- Synonyms: continue, preserve, prolong indefinitely
- Antonyms: discontinue, abolish, abandon
- In most cultures, people try to <u>perpetuate</u> the customs of their ancestors.

### 6. precedent

- An example that may serve as a basis for imitation of later action
- Noun
- Synonyms: guide, tradition
- We hope that students at other schools in our city will follow our <u>precedent</u> in volunteer work and charitable contributions.

### 7. punitive

- Inflicting or aiming at punishment
- Adjective
- Synonyms: penalizing, retaliatory
- The general led a <u>punitive</u> expedition against the rebel forces.

### 8. redress

- Verb: to set right
- Noun: relief from wrong or injury
- Synonyms: rectify, correct, mitigate
- An apology can go a long way to <u>redress</u> the hurt feelings caused by an insensitive comment or a thoughtless act.

## 9. sojourn

- Noun: a temporary stay
- Verb: to stay for a time
- Synonyms: visit, stopover, brief stay
- Many American graduates <u>sojourn</u> abroad before they begin working full-time at home.

### 10. urbane

- Refined in manner or style, suave
- Adjective
- Synonym: elegant
- An <u>urbane</u> host puts guests at ease by appearing totally confident and unruffled no matter what happens.
