1. insidious

- Intended to deceive or entrap; sly, treacherous
- · Adjective
- · Synonyms: cunning, underhanded, perfidious
- · Antonyms: frank, ingenuous, aboveboard
- The investigators uncovered an insidious scheme to rob people of their life savings.

Z. intimation

- · a hint, indirect suggestion
- noun
- Synonyms: clue, indication, inkling
- They were too proud to give an intimation of their financial difficulties.

3. opulent

- · wealthy, luxurious; ample; grandiose
- · adjective
- · Synonyms: rich, lavish, plentiful, abundant
- Antonyms: poverty-stricken, wretched, destitute
- The tour guide showed us the <u>opulent</u> living quarters of the royal family.

4. pliable

- · easily bent, flexible; easily influenced
- · adjective
- · Synonyms: supple, adaptable, resilient
- · Antonyms: rigid, inflexible, recalcitrant
- Spools of <u>pliable</u> copper wire are standard equipment for many kinds of maintenance workers, including electricians.

5. reiterate

- · to say again, repeat
- · verb
- · Synonyms: restate, rehash, recapitulate
- Effective speakers often <u>reiterate</u> an important statement for emphasis.

6. stolid

- not easily moved mentally or emotionally; dull, unresponsive
- · adjective
- · Synonyms: impassive, phlegmatic
- Antonyms: emotional, oversensitive, highstrung
- Stolid people can generally be expected to take most things in stride.

7. tentative

- · Experimental in nature, uncertain, hesitant
- · Adjective
- · Synonyms: provisional, inconclusive
- · Antonyms: definite, conclusive, confirmed
- Negotiators have come up with a tentative agreement that will keep both sides at the bargaining table past the strike deadline.

8. unhempt

- Not combed; untidy; not properly maintained; unpolished, rude
- · Adjective
- Synonyms: sloppy, disheveled, disordered, rough
- · Antonyms: well-groomed, tidy, neat, natty
- According to my parents, the latest fashions make me and my friends look unkempt.

9. verbatim

- · Word for word; exactly as written or spoken
- · Adjective, adverb
- · Synonyms: exact, precisely
- · Antonyms: paraphrased
- Newspapers often publish the <u>verbatim</u> text of an important speech.

10. warily

- · Cautiously, with great care
- fldverb
- · Synonyms: carefully, prudently, gingerly
- · Antonyms: recklessly, heedlessly, incautiously
- The hikers made their way warily up the steep and rocky trail.
